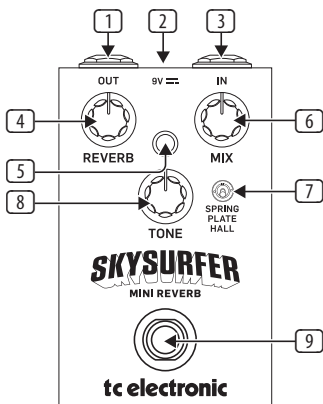


# Quick Start Guide

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## SKYSURFER MINI REVERB

Studio-Quality Reverb with 3 Award-Winning TC Electronic Algorithms in a Compact Footprint



1. **OUT** – Send the signal to other pedals or a guitar amp via ¼" cable.
2. **9 V DC** – Connect a standard 9 V power supply (not included).
3. **IN** – Connect your guitar via ¼" cable.
4. **REVERB** – Adjusts the length of reverb decay.
5. **LED** – Lights when the pedal is engaged.
6. **MIX** – Adjusts the wet/dry mix such that turning clockwise results in more reverb.
7. **TYPE** – Selects reverb model type – Spring, Plate or Hall.
8. **TONE** – Adjusts the brightness of the reverb.
9. **FOOTSWITCH** – Press to engage or bypass the pedal. True bypass leaves the guitar signal completely unaffected whenever the pedal is not engaged.

**SKY SURFER MINI REVERB**
